#### SCHEDULED INFORMATION REPORTS

#### President's Update

2019-401

Dr. Sidor reported that the LSSC Foundation, Inc. has hired Sunrise Consulting Group as a lobbyist on behalf of the college. They have already started making connections for us. Dr. Sidor is going to Lake County Days in Tallahassee on the February 20<sup>th</sup> - 21<sup>st</sup> and they have already set-up meetings with connections beyond our local delegation.

The big issue revolving around legislation is PECO. Currently, Florida has \$733 million sitting on the PECO list. Rep. Fine has indicated that they will be going through the list projects by project to see if the recommendations are appropriate for the funding requested. Lake-Sumter is on the list at #22 for roofs, given the current PECO schedule that would take four years and #38 for fire systems replacement five to six years.

Dr. Sidor discussed House Bills 6007, 189, 217 and 381.

HB6007 filed by Rep. Sabatini licenses to carry concealed weapons or firearms does not have a senate sponsor and not likely that it will.

HB189 filed by Rep. Zika postsecondary education for secondary students does not have a senate sponsor yet but it is anticipated that it will get one. If passes this bill will require instructional materials be made available to certain dual enrollment students free of charge; provides additional options for students participating in early college program; revises program, contract, notification, & reporting requirements; authorizes charter schools to establish early college programs; provides that certain students & schools are not responsible for specified costs; provides FTE bonuses under certain circumstances.

HB217 postsecondary education for certain military veterans. Postsecondary Education for Certain Military Personnel; Requires BOG & SBE to create uniform system for award of postsecondary college credit to certain service members & veterans of U.S. military; provides requirements for such uniform system; provides transcript fee waiver for active duty members of Armed Forces of U.S., certain veterans, & their spouses & dependents.

HB381 sponsored by Robinson, school district career centers. School District Career Centers; Authorizes school district career centers to conduct certain associate degree nursing programs. The college Council of Presidents are not opposed of them moving in this direction but are requesting meet the same requirements that we do, SACSCOC accreditation, the same funding streams and mechanism, and the same performance measures.

HB839 is primarily a university system bill. All of our bills have been submitted and we are ready for the deadline of March 5<sup>th</sup>.

The governor's budget wasn't exactly what we hoped. A good portion of the income was

#### Other Divisional Updates:

- -Enrollment/Student Affairs and Academic Affairs recently co-hosted a Guided Pathways Summit to begin the process of implementing this national model in the future.
- -The South Lake campus Veteran College and Career Success Center was formally opened on Monday 2/18/19.
- -Mr. Pete Wahl recently presented to the Educational Opportunity Programs TRIO programs and Ms. Emily Lee is scheduled to present later this semester. Thank you for your willingness to give of your time.
- -Dr. Claire Brady was recently selected as a Faculty member for the 2019 National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA) week-long New Professionals Institute at UNC Charlotte in June.

#### **Doug Wymer**

Dr. Wymer reported on January 17 we were notified that the RN to BSN program has been granted Candidacy Status by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN). This is an important step toward full program accreditation within the next two years. Thanks to the efforts of Dr. Robin Walter who is the RN to BSN program director, Dr. Lange and many others who contributed to this effort.

The faculty have chosen Jacklyn Pierce, Assistant Professor of English as the LSSC Professor of the Year and she is preparing to represent the College at regional and statewide events as this year's competition unfolds. Win, lose, or draw, we are happy to have Jackie representing LSSC

in this year's competition. Of course, it would be great to win the statewide competition three years in a row...

Dr. Scott Hopkins, Dean of Arts and Letters has been invited to speak at the AFC Conference on College Teaching and Learning in April. He has been asked to share the best-practice strategies in English instruction in the context of LSSC's writing emporium. The presentation will include the need for research-based methodology that is needed to fully explore the impact of this and other educational practices.

LSSC was named a top 10 finalist in the instructional programs and services category of the 2019 Bellwether Awards for the RISE Summer Math Academy. Associate Professor Sybil Brown and Title III Grant Manager Kim Kidd presented a session in San Antonio, Texas on highlighting the RISE Academy. Although they did not win the Bellwether Award this year, this is the 2nd time in 3 years that the RISE Summer Math Academy has made it into the top 10.

On Friday February 15 over 350 people attended the second TED<sup>x</sup>LSSC event. The day was a great success thanks to the efforts of Amber Karlins, Instructor of English and Heather Elmatti, Assistant Professor of Speech, and an army of volunteers. Among the presenters were many LSSC people including James Simmons, student; Mark Duslak, Director of Student Development; Steve Clark, Associate Dean of Math and Science; Jackie Pierce, Assistant Professor of English, Dr. Scott Hopkins, Dean of Arts and Letters; and Nicole Duslak, Director of Educational Opportunity Programs.

Dr. Amy Albee-Levine is serving as co-chair of the state's Perkins V Workgroup. The Strengthening Career and Technical Education Act for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century or, Perkins V, was authorized in July 2018 and will take effect July 2020. The Perkins V Workgroup is responsible for working with the Florida Department of Education to develop the Florida State Plan for Perkins V.

Bob Seigworth was asked to serve as chair of the Leesburg HS Power Academy. Through his role as chair, Mr. Seigworth will lead the curriculum design for the program and work to develop a pipeline of talented students prepared to enter our energy programs.

#### **Heather Bigard**

Dr. Bigard announced the new Lake-Sumter Safe application. This is our very own branded app with all information on how to be safe on our campus. There are many features within this app to keep our campus safe.

She reported that the final operation report has been received. We were successful at positioning ourselves within the auditor to make it clear what is statutorily required versus what the recommendations made by the auditors. She was very pleased with the outcome. There is one item that is being recommended for the board to review and take to the Board of Education. This has to do with our terminal pay for sick pay out. The auditors noted that we are not using the classification of non-educational support employees and we believe all of our employees support education in some way. We were successful in producing an artifact from the chancellor from 2004 stating that all state colleges were given the same direction on how to implement this.

On Friday, March 8<sup>th</sup> we are planning an Employee Appreciation lunch if any of the board would like to attend please plan to be at the baseball field for fun, food, and a Lakehawk baseball game.

#### Mid-Year Review/2018-2019 Finances

Dr. Bigard reported on the mid-year projects, she provided a very short analysis and is open for questions. We have an increased enrollment due to our marketing strategies and are in a very good position due to that. We have an overall surplus that we are anticipating at about \$760,000 at the end of the year we will ask the board to transfer \$350,000-\$500,000 over to Fund 7, so we can take care of facilities repairs as we do every year.

#### Strategic Plan

Dr. Bigard reported on the current draft of the strategic plan. They worked individually with the pillar teams to come up with the objectives and initiatives to support the overall categories. There are five main pillars. Each project will have key performance indicators attached to them so we can develop the appropriate bench marks so we can track our progress. The next step to the strategic plan process is to feed this out to the community and getting additional input, which will lead to the final stage of completing all of the projects.

Mrs. Geraci-Carver reported that we received a ruling from the hearing officer we asked they do an administrative review of the petition cards that came in. Initially they filed 18 and supplemented two, so the union can move forward for a vote of the unit.

On Feb. 4, 2019 the college received notice from the United Faculty of Florida-Lake Sumter State College that it wishes to commence contract negotiations in April. The college has provided dates for negotiations.

She updated that after a proposed amendment was prepared extending the deadlines for closing, development, state designation, etc. She will be moving forward with the East Lake Property donation with Dr. Sidor and Dr. Bigard.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Naming of the Health Science Building 2019-406

Dr. Sidor reported that Orlando Health/South Lake Hospital donated approximately one million dollars to help start the construction of the Science Health Building and since that time they have contributed \$200,000 for internal support and equipment over the past two years. Plus they purchased a vehicle to shuttle students back and forth. Additionally, Orlando Health has committed to \$70,000 per year on an ongoing basis in personnel services to support the HSCA.

It is requested approval for naming the South Lake Campus Science-Health Building to the Science-Health Partnership Building. Tim Morris made the motion to name the building as requested and Marcia Butler seconded and motion carried.

Re: Monthly Fiscal Report – YTD February 2019

Each month a fiscal report is prepared to appraise your office and the District Board of Trustees on the status of the College budget. The MONTHLY FISCAL STATUS REPORT of the General Operating Fund (Fund1) provides a comparative summary of budget-to-actual revenues and expenses for the current period.

In addition to the Fund 1 Operating Budget report, provided on a monthly basis, this month includes current balance sheet.

#### **FUND 1 OPERATING BUDGET**

We are currently eight months into our fiscal year or 66% completed.

# AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF LAKE-SUMTER STATE COLLEGE AND THE DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD OF SUMTER COUNTY RELATING TO TECHNICAL AND CERTIFICATE TRAINING

This Agreement ("Agreement") made and entered into by and between **The District Board of Trustees of Lake-Sumter State College**, a political subdivision of the State of Florida ("LSSC"), and **The District Board of Sumter County** ("SCS"). Collectively, LSSC and SCS may be referred to as the "PARTIES."

#### **RECITALS**

Whereas, The District School Board of Sumter County desires to enhance its career pathways for students who are in Sumter County Schools Career Academies; and

Whereas, LSSC desires to be the institution that provides career pathways and certification programs for SCS students, as well as provides Associate of Science (AS) and Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degrees to SCS students who are in SCS's Career Academies; and

Whereas, SCS desires to contract with LSSC for LSSC to provide career pathways and certifications for all SCS students, but especially for those in Career Academies; and

Whereas, the PARTIES desire to acknowledge their intentions in this written Agreement, and each commit to the responsibilities set forth herein; and

Whereas, this Agreement is entered into pursuant to and in accordance with all applicable provisions of Florida law.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION of mutual covenants set forth in this Agreement, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the PARTIES agree as follows:

- a. <u>RECITALS</u>. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct, form a material part of this Agreement and are incorporated herein by reference.
- b. <u>TERM OF AGREEMENT</u>. This Agreement will be effective beginning on the date of execution by both parties and until such time a 30-day notice of termination is submitted by either party.

#### c. LSSC OBLIGATIONS. LSSC will:

- 1. Provide qualified faculty to provide the necessary training and certifications as agreed on by LSSC and SCS;
- 2. Provide classrooms and facilities on the LSSC Sumterville campus or in a location of mutual agreement for training Sumter County Schools' students.
- 3. Oversee the scheduling of classes for such courses.
- 4. Provide career pathways, certifications, and degree opportunities to eligible SCS students.

#### d. **SCS OBLIGATIONS**. SCS will:

- 1. Pay LSSC the cost per student for any training provided by LSSC. This training and the associated costs may vary by course and therefore the costs and billing details will be determined separately and agreed to prior to the training being offered.
- e. <u>SCS STUDENTS.</u> SCS students, while attending classes on the Sumter Campus, shall adhere to LSSC rules and policies.
- f. <u>COOPERATION</u>. The SCS Career Technical and Adult Education Specialist and the LSSC Dean of Workforce Education shall cooperate with each other in fulfilling the terms of this Agreement. In the event the Specialist and Dean are unable to reach an agreement, the dispute shall be resolved by the Superintendent of SCS and the President of LSSC.

#### g. LIABILITY:

- 1. LSSC shall be responsible for any and all claims, damages, liability and court awards including costs, expenses and attorneys' fees incurred as a result of any action or omission of LSSC or its officers, employees and agents in connection with the performance of, or rights and responsibilities set forth in this Agreement.
- 2. SCS shall be responsible for any and all claims, damages, liability and court awards including costs, expenses and attorneys' fees incurred as a result of any action or omission of SCS or its officers, employees and agents in connection with the performance of, or rights and responsibilities set forth in this Agreement.
- 3. Nothing in this Section or any other provisions of this Agreement shall be construed as a waiver of the notice requirements, defenses, immunities, and limitations the PARTIES may have under Florida law. The provisions of

PARTIES may have under Florida law. The provisions of this section are solely for the benefit of the PARTIES and are not intended to create or grant any rights, contractually or otherwise to any third party.

h. <u>FURTHER AGREEMENT/S</u>. LSSC and SCS acknowledge future agreements between the PARTIES will be necessary, including for transportation, and individual offerings agreed to by LSSC and SCS. The PARTIES each agree to work cooperatively in developing such other agreements as may be necessary from time to time.

# i. <u>DEFAULT, TERMINATION AND ENFORCEMENT OF</u> AGREEMENT.

- 1. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time by providing a 30-day written notice to the other party.
- 2. If for any cause other than something outside either party's control, SCS or LSSC shall default in the performance of any of the material covenants, agreements, terms, conditions or stipulations of this Agreement and shall fail to cure such default within fifteen (15) calendar days after receiving written notice of such default from the non-defaulting party, in addition to any other rights and remedies available to it, the non-defaulting party will thereupon have the right to terminate this Agreement upon providing the defaulting party five (5) business days prior written notice of its intent to terminate (such five (5) day period to commence upon the defaulting party's receipt of such notice). Notice shall be provided to the undersigned persons at the address listed.
- 3. If this Agreement is terminated under either subsection A. or B. above, notwithstanding that termination may be immediate, any training in progress shall continue until the end of that training session so as to minimize any negative impact to students.

#### j. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES.

- 1. LSSC represents and warrants to SCS that: (i) the District Board of LSSC of Lake-Sumter State College is a duly authorized and existing political subdivision of the State of Florida; (ii) the LSSC have the full right and authority to enter into this Agreement; (iii) each of the persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the LSSC is authorized to do so; and (iv) this Agreement constitutes a valid and legally binding obligation of the LSSC, enforceable in accordance with its terms.
- 2. SCS represents and warrants to the LSSC that: (i) SCS has the full right and authority to enter into this Agreement; (ii) each of the persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the SCS is

authorized to do so; and (iii) this Agreement constitutes a valid and legally binding obligation of the SCS, enforceable in accordance with its terms.

- k. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>. Neither LSSC nor SCS may assign any rights or delegate any duties under this Agreement without the written consent of the other party.
- l. <u>NOTICES</u>. All notices, demands, requests for approvals or other communications which are required to be given by either party to the other shall be in writing and shall be deemed given and delivered on the date delivered in person to the authorized representative of the recipient provided below, upon the expiration of five calendar days following the date mailed by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, or upon the date delivered by overnight courier (signature required) and addressed:

- m. <u>WAIVER</u>. No act or omission or commission of either party, including without limitation, any failure to exercise any right, remedy, or recourse, shall be deemed to be a waiver, release, or modification of the same. Such a waiver, release, or modification is to be effect only through a written modification to this Agreement.
- n. **GOVERNING LAW**. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida. Venue shall be in Sumter County, Florida.
- o. **NO THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY**. Persons not a party to this Agreement may not claim any benefit hereunder or as third party beneficiaries hereto.

- p. <u>HEADINGS</u>. The paragraph headings are inserted herein for convenience and reference only and in no way define, limit, or otherwise describe the scope or intent of any provisions hereof.
- q. **DRAFTING OF AGREEMENT**. This Agreement has been drafted and negotiated by LSSC and SCS and the same shall not be construed against either party by virtue of the identity of the drafter.
- r. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT**. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the PARTIES and no change will be valid unless made by supplemental written agreement executed by both PARTIES.
- s. **SEVERABILITY**. Should any section or part of any section of this Agreement be rendered void, invalid, or unenforceable by any court of law, for any reason, such a determination shall not render void, invalid, or unenforceable any other section or any other part of any section of this Agreement provided that the PARTIES continue to enjoy the intended benefits for which they entered this Agreement.

#### 2019-2020 Articulation Agreement Between Lake Technical College and Lake-Sumter State College

In a continuing effort to provide opportunities for students to transition into Lake-Sumter State College's postsecondary programs, Lake-Sumter State College (LSSC) and Lake Technical College (LTC) agree to cooperate in the development and implementation of a discipline specific agreement for the following programs:

#### **Transfer Process:**

The transferring student must have compiled a GPA of 2.0 or better and must furnish a certificate of completion for one of the approved postsecondary certificate programs at Lake Technical college, along with an official signed copy of their student record.

To have articulated courses reported on the official Lake-Sumter State College transcript, transferring students must:

- 1. Meet regular College entrance requirements.
- 2. Complete the College Application and pay the College Admission Fee.
- 3. Be accepted into Lake-Sumter State College within five years of completing one of the specified industrial-related postsecondary certificate programs.
- 4. Declare a major in the articulated program.
- 5. Comply with the appropriate placement, course prerequisites, and requirements of the College, including successful completion of college preparatory courses, if required.
- 6. Successfully complete nine (9) credit hours of required course work with a C or better in each course at Lake-Sumter State College while enrolled on either a part-time or full time basis.
- 7. Complete Articulation Credit Transfer Form with Workforce Development for review and approval.
- 8. Provide a copy of current, program-related licensure and/or earned industry certification.

#### **Course Offerings**

The Parties understand that the available courses may change on an annual basis. The Parties agree that revisions to the available course list may be made with the approval of LTC or its designee and LSSC Career Pathways Consortium Committee. A list of programs for the 2019-2020 year is attached as Exhibit A. Included are the following programs offered at LSSC: Associate in Science (AS) in Management Technology, AS in Business Administration, College Credit Certificate (CCC) in Business Specialist, CCC in Business Operations, CCC in Business Management, AS in Computer Information Technology, AS in Health Information Technology, CCC in Medical Office Management, AS in Criminal Justice Technology, and CCC in Criminal Justice Technology Specialist.

#### **Educational Program Review Process:**

LSSC and LTC faculty and staff with responsibility for supervision and coordination of the programs meet annually to review program documentation, program and course outcomes alignment, and LTC student learning outcomes attainment data.

This review ensures that the articulated credit is of high quality as determined by LSSC faculty and administration, is comparable in content and rigor to course content delivered at LSSC, and is

### CAREER PATHWAYS ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEENTHE SCHOOL BOARD OF LAKE COUNTY, FLORIDA and LAKE-SUMTER STATE COLLEGE

In a continuing effort for the School Board of Lake County, Florida (School Board) and Lake-Sumter State College (LSSC) to provide career opportunities for secondary school students in Career Pathways programs for transition into postsecondary institutions, LSSC agrees to extend at no cost to the student (other than the application fee) college credit at LSSC according to the following requirements:

#### I. Articulation with Lake-Sumter State College

To articulate courses taken in Career and Technical Education Career Pathways Program of Study at Lake County Schools (LCS) Secondary Schools to LSSC, students must meet the following requirements to earn college credit.

- 1. The student shall be considered a Career Pathways student, defined as a student in an articulated, sequential CTE program and enrolled in Level II or III courses that lead to a college credit certificate (CCC), Associate in Science (AS), Associate in Applied Science (AAS), or Associate in Arts (AA) degree, and/or apprenticeship programs.
- 2. Pass the specified high school courses identified on the CTE Career Pathways Program of Study within a career and technical program with a minimum grade of C.
- 3. Pay the LSSC Admissions application fee.
- 4. Meet regular LSSC entrance requirements, including appropriate placement and course prerequisite requirements of the college.
- 5. Credit may be earned in any combination of the following ways:

**OPTION A.** Take and pass the LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam) for courses listed on the articulation pages contained within this document. The student must enroll and attend LSSC after high school graduation or as a Collegiate High School Early Admissions student in order to receive the credit earned by the LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam). LSSC will award the credit for the select program up to 24 months from the time of high school graduation or while enrolled as a Collegiate High School Early Admissions student as described in the annual Collegiate High School Dual Enrollment agreement.

**OPTION B.** Receive credit for an industry certification(s) earned while enrolled in a Career Pathways Program of Study which corresponds to an LSSC program. A list of approved certifications along with the equivalent articulated credit is available on the individual program pages contained within this document. If the certification product version is different from the listed industry standard, LSSC faculty will review the certification to determine equivalence.

The student must present the Career Pathways Certificate of Completion, copy of industry certification, and/or present a high school transcript verifying the successful completion of the technical courses and/or industry certification, if applicable, to LSSC's Workforce Development Office.

#### II. Assessment and Course Equivalency

- 1. The LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam) study guide, prepared by LSSC program faculty for each program area will be shared with high school faculty. The LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam) may be written, portfolio, performance-based or a combination thereof. LSSC will provide high school faculty, upon written request, the opportunity to take the LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam).
- 2. Faculty and staff on the technical discipline subcommittees have examined and compared the competencies within the technical courses to be articulated from the high school curriculum to the postsecondary institutions to determine the equivalency of the content. Each technical subcommittee will develop and regularly update the discipline-specific Program of Study content equivalency descriptions.

#### III. Term and Termination

This agreement shall be reviewed annually and shall be in effect from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 or until either party chooses to terminate the Agreement. Either party may terminate this agreement with ninety (90) days written notice.

#### IV. Course Offerings

ADDDATED

The Parties understand that the available courses may change on an annual basis. A sample list for the 2019-2020 year is attached as Exhibit A. The Parties agree that revisions to the available course list may be made with the approval of the School Board or its designee and LSSC Career Pathways Consortium Committee. All other modifications are subject to Section V of this Agreement.

#### V. Modification or Amendment

Except as otherwise outlined in Section IV, this Agreement may be modified or amended only by a written document signed by authorized representatives of the School Board and LSSC.

# CAREER PATHWAYS ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN SUMTER COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOL and LAKE-SUMTER STATE COLLEGE

In a continuing effort for the Sumter County School District and Lake-Sumter State College (LSSC) to provide career opportunities for secondary school students in Career Pathways programs for transition into postsecondary institutions, LSSC agrees to extend at no cost to the student (other than the application fee) college credit at LSSC according to the following requirements:

#### I. Articulation with Lake-Sumter State College

To articulate courses taken in Career and Technical Education (CTE) Career Pathways Program of Study at Sumter secondary schools to LSSC, students must meet the following requirements to earn college credit.

- 1. The student shall be considered a Career Pathways student, defined as a student in an articulated, sequential CTE program and enrolled in Level II or III courses that lead to a college credit certificate (CCC), Associate in Science (AS), Associate in Applied Science (AAS), or Associate in Arts (AA) degree, and/or apprenticeship programs.
- 2. Pass the specified high school courses identified on the CTE Career Pathways Program of Study within a career and technical program with a minimum grade of C.
- 3. Pay the LSSC Admissions application fee.
- 4. Meet regular LSSC entrance requirements, including appropriate placement and course prerequisite requirements of the college.
- 5. Credit may be earned in any combination of the following ways.

**OPTION A.** Take and pass the LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam) for courses listed on the articulation pages contained within this document. The student must enroll and attend LSSC after high school graduation or as a Collegiate High School Early Admissions student in order to receive the credit earned by the LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam). LSSC will award the credit for the select program up to 24 months from the time of high school graduation or while enrolled as a Collegiate High School Early Admissions student as described in the annual Collegiate High School Dual Enrollment agreement.

**OPTION B.** Receive credit for an industry certification(s) earned while enrolled in a Career Pathways Program of Study which corresponds to an LSSC program. A list of approved certifications along with the equivalent articulated credit is available on the individual program pages contained within this document. If the certification product version is different from the listed industry standard, LSSC faculty will review the certification to determine equivalence.

The student must present the Career Pathways Certificate of Completion, copy of Industry certification, and/or present a high school transcript verifying the successful completion of the technical courses and/or industry certification, if applicable, to LSSC's Workforce Development Office.

#### II. Assessment and Course Equivalency

- 1. The LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam) study guide, prepared by LSSC program faculty for each program area will be shared with high school faculty. The LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam) may be written, portfolio, performance-based or a combination thereof. LSSC will provide high school faculty, upon written request, the opportunity to take the LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam).
- 2. Faculty and staff on the technical discipline subcommittees have examined and compared the competencies within the technical courses to be articulated from the high school curriculum to the postsecondary institutions to determine the equivalency of the content. Each technical subcommittee will develop and regularly update the discipline-specific Program of Study content equivalency descriptions.

#### III. Terms of Agreement

This agreement shall be reviewed annually and shall be in effect from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 or until either party identifies a need for revision or terminates this agreement with thirty days written notice.

#### IV. Course Offerings

The Parties understand that the available courses may change on an annual basis. A sample list for the 2019-2020 year is attached as Exhibit A. The Parties agree that revisions to the available course list may be made with the approval of the School Board or its designee and LSSC Career Pathways Consortium Committee. All other modifications are subject to Section V of this Agreement.

#### V. Modification or Amendment

Except as otherwise outlined in Section IV, this Agreement may be modified or amended only by a written document signed by authorized representatives of the School Board and LSSC.

#### 2019-2020 Career Pathways Articulation Agreement Between The School Board of Marion County, Florida and Lake-Sumter State College

In an effort to provide opportunities for The School Board of Marion County, Florida, secondary school students in corresponding Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs to transition into the Lake-Sumter State College (LSSC) postsecondary program listed below, LSSC agrees to award college credit to eligible CTE students according to the criteria delineated below. These credit hours may or may not be accepted for transfer credit by other institutions.

#### I. Articulation with Lake-Sumter State College

To articulate courses taken in Career and Technical Education Career Pathways (CTE) Program of Study at Marion County secondary schools to LSSC, students must meet the following requirements to earn college credit:

- 1. The student shall be considered a CTE Career Pathways student, defined as a student in an articulated, sequential CTE program and enrolled in Level II or III courses that lead to a college credit certificate (CCC), Associate in Science (AS), Associate in Applied Science (AAS), or Associate in Arts (AA) degree, and/or apprenticeship programs.
- 2. Pass the specified high school courses identified on the CTE Career Pathways Program of Study within a career and technical program with a minimum grade of B, and provide a letter of recommendation from the high school program instructor.
- 3. Pay the LSSC Admissions application fee.
- 4. Meet regular LSSC entrance requirements including appropriate placement and course prerequisite requirements of the college.
- 5. Credit may be earned in any combination of the following ways, Option A and/or Option B:

**OPTION A.** Take and pass the LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam) for courses listed on the articulation pages contained within the program of study pages (Exhibit A). The student must enroll and attend LSSC after high school to receive the credit earned by the LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam). LSSC will award the credit for the select program up to 24 months from the time of high school graduation.

**OPTION B.** Receive credit for an industry certification(s) earned while enrolled in a CTE Career Pathways Program of Study which corresponds to an LSSC program. A list of approved certifications along with the equivalent articulated credit is available on the individual program pages contained within this document. If the certification product version is different from the listed industry standard, LSSC faculty will review the certification to determine equivalence.

The student must present the Career Pathways Certificate of Completion, copy of industry certification, and/or present a high school transcript verifying the successful completion of the technical courses and/or industry certification, if applicable, to LSSC's Workforce Development Office.

#### II. Assessment and Course Equivalency:

- 1. The LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam) study guide, prepared by LSSC program faculty for each program area will be shared with high school faculty. The LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam) may be written, portfolio, performance-based or a combination thereof. LSSC will provide their high school faculty counterparts, upon written request, the opportunity to take the LSSC common assessment (Credit by Exam).
- 2. Faculty and staff on the technical discipline subcommittees have examined and compared the competencies within the technical courses to be articulated from the CTE high school curriculum to the postsecondary institutions to determine the equivalency of the content. Each technical subcommittee will develop and regularly update the discipline-specific Program of Study content equivalency descriptions.

#### III. Terms of Agreement:

This agreement shall be reviewed annually and shall be in effect from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 or until either party identifies a need for revision or terminates this agreement with thirty days written notice.

#### IV. Modification or Amendment:

Except as otherwise outlined in Section II, this Agreement may be modified or amended only by a written document signed by authorized representatives for the School Board and LSSC.

#### V. Compensation:

This agreement is a no-cost agreement.

#### District Board of Trustees Meeting 03/27/2019 Enrollment & Student Affairs update

We are now in the home stretch to the end of the semester! Students are back from spring break and are hopefully ready to finish strong in the weeks ahead.

#### **Summer & Fall Enrollment Update**

Registration has begun for the summer and fall semesters. Encouraging enrollment now for fall positively contributes to overall retention efforts.

#### **Commencement Update**

We had a record number of students apply for spring graduation ( $\sim$ 600) and a record number of students indicating that they plan to walk in one of the two ceremonies. This spring will bring newly updated graduation robes for the Bachelor degree students and a more formal diploma holder gift for both the Associates degree and Bachelor degree students. This year will also mark our first graduating class from the Health Sciences Collegiate Academy (HSCA).

Spring Commencement ceremonies are scheduled for: Wednesday 5/01/19 @6pm (Clermont ARC) and -Friday 5/03/19 @10am (Leesburg Kelly Convocation Center).

#### Lakehawk Mascot Launch

We conducted a Mascot naming survey and received nearly 800 votes from students, faculty, staff, alumni, and community members. The Lakehawk Mascot's name will be revealed in late March. Until recently, all documentation related to student incident reports, behavioral interventions, academic integrity violations, campus safety incident reports, Title IX, and Clery, etc...were housed and managed separately in various departments by different custodians.

Although our staff work closely together, without a single centralized system, continuity across departments, document tracking, privacy controls, document storage, data reporting, and FERPA compliance were increasingly problematic. This year, we made the decision to invest in Maxient, the leading software for this purpose in higher education (clients include 800+ institutions).

#### What is Maxient

A centralized system that manages all incident reports, letters, and documentation for student discipline, academic integrity, security incident reports, behavioral early alerts, Title IX, CLERY reporting, and the cross-divisional CARE team. It can also be used for administrative appeal tracking and counseling referrals.

Maxient is an integral component of a college's overall early alert efforts, helping to identify students in distress and coordinate the efforts of various departments to provide follow-up.

Maxient is a cloud-based system that can be accessed 24/7.

Dear Trustees:

Below is an update on several matters of interest to the Board.

On March 4, 2019 the College filed a Joint Stipulation in Support of Consent Election Agreement in Case No. RC-2018-042 (Part Time Adjunct Instructors). The Union agreed with College as to the appropriate definition of the bargaining unit. Included in the bargaining unit are: "All part-time adjunct instructors employed by Lake Sumter State College (LSSC) who teach at least one credit-bearing course at any of its campuses ...., unless expressly excluded." Excluded are: "All tenured and tenure-track faculty, full-time faculty, employees covered by an existing collective bargaining agreement, faculty who teach only online courses, full-time employees of the College who also teach a class as an adjunct instructor, dual enrollment adjuncts who are not paid by LSSC, faulty teaching non-credit bearing courses, administrators, guards, all supervisory, managerial, and confidential employees, and all other employees of LSSC." Additionally, the College and Union agreed to a mail ballot election commencing Friday, April 5 with ballots being counted on Friday, April 26.

The College and United Faculty of Florida-Lake Sumter State College will commence contract negotiations on April 2, 2019.

#### LSSC proposing student fee modifications for 2019-20 year

**LEESBURG, Fla.** – Lake-Sumter State College is providing public notification of proposed changes in student fees for the 2019-2020 academic year.

In accordance with *Florida Statutes* section 1009.23(20), Lake-Sumter State College is notifying the community of proposed changes in institutional student fees before its consideration at the District Board of Trustees of Lake-Sumter State College meeting. These modifications are scheduled for consideration at the March 27, 2019, meeting that will occur at 5:00pm in the Boardroom (Rm 210) of the Students Services Building on the Leesburg Campus.

Laboratory fees are charged in accordance with *Florida Statutes* section 1009.23(12)(a). Lake-Sumter State College reviews laboratory fees every year, and these fees are used to purchase consumable supplies, cover laboratory expenses and student insurance specific to these classes in excess of normal supplies required for classroom instruction.

No tuition increases are being proposed at this time.

Florida Statutes section 1009.23(20) requires a Florida College System institution to post these changes on the institution's website and issue a press release notification at least 28 days prior to consideration at a District Board of Trustees meeting.

#### **OVERVIEW**

The College has followed a modified four-day summer work schedule since 1979. During the modified work schedule period, the benefits to the College and staff include:

- 1. Savings in utility expenses by closing buildings and turning off A/C and lighting systems.
- 2. Additional maintenance and upgrades on major equipment and facilities are performed without interfering with classroom activities.
- 3. Benefits to personnel promoting positive morale by providing flexible working schedules.
- 4. The College is using the four-day summer work schedule as part of its employee recruitment strategy to attract applicants currently working five days per week.
- 5. The summer work schedule will provide extended office hours until 5:00 or 5:30 pm, Monday through Thursday.

#### **ANALYSIS**

The President's Cabinet has approved and recommends the summer work schedule (four day work week schedule) for Summer, 2019. Employees will average 8 hours and 45 minutes per day for four days, working a total of 37.5 hours each week.

#### RECOMMENDATION

The President requests Board approval of the modified summer work schedule for the period of Monday, May 6, 2019 through Friday, July 26, 2019 as outlined in the attached documents.

# LAKE-SUMTER STATE COLLEGE SUMMER WORK SCHEDULE

May 6, 2019 through July 26, 2019

#### **GENERAL**:

- The College will maintain a four (4) day Summer Work Schedule beginning May 6, 2019 through July 26, 2019.
- During the summer work schedule period, employees will have their assigned work hours changed to a four-day workweek from Monday through Thursday, working an average 9 hours and 22 minutes per day.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR THE FOUR DAY WORK WEEK ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

- Normal work hours will be from 8:00 a.m. to 5:52 p.m. with a half-hour lunch. This will give a total of 9 hours and 22 minutes. With permission of the senior administrator who reports to the President, employees may work such hours as 7:30 a.m. to 5:22 p.m. with a half-hour for lunch or such other hours as equal a 9 hour / 22 minute workday. The vice president (or senior administrator who reports to the President) supervising the department where the employee works has the responsibility to approve and control the work schedules of all employees in their areas.
- Total hours per week equal 37.5 hours. Any approved overtime pay will be considered regular pay from 37.5 hours to 40 hours, with time-and-one-half paid after forty hours.
- Although facilities personnel will still maintain a flexible schedule to accommodate special
  cleaning and maintenance schedules, it is the intent of the College that the facilities be
  closed on Fridays to obtain the maximum cost savings possible. The College does not
  intend to have the heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems operating after closing
  on Thursday. Such will be turned on for operation on Monday.
- The College will be closed for Memorial Day on Monday, May 27, 2019. The College will be open for business on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday the week of the May 27th holiday.
- The College will be closed for Independence Day on Thursday, July 4, 2019. The College will be open for business on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday the week of the July 4th holiday.
- Vacation and other leave time will be reported on Leave sheets at 9 hours and 22 minutes per day or actual hours taken.
- Use Summer Work Schedule form (separate attachment) to prepare an individual employee's 2019 summer schedule.
