### 8:30 – 9:45 AM Setting Students Up for Success: Incorporating Information Literacy Through Collaboration

**Presenters:** Christina Wray, Digital Learning & Engagement Librarian, joined the University of Central Florida Libraries in March of 2017. Before joining UCF, Christina worked as the librarian at the Indiana Institute on Disability and Community at Indiana University. Wray has a Master of Library Science as well as a Master of Education in Adult Education from Indiana University. Her work is focused on creating engaging informal learning experiences for all students, especially supporting skills which often remain part of the hidden curriculum of academic success.

Peggy L. Nuhn is a "UCF Connect" associate faculty librarian at the University of Central Florida's Sanford/Lake Mary campus, a joint campus with Seminole State College of Florida, where she teaches information literacy for university and college students. Nuhn is a graduate of the Sunshine State Library Leadership Institute, served on the board of the Florida Library Association, and has presented on student information literacy and the importance of librarian collaboration for transfer student success at statewide and national conferences. She is the author of *Supporting Transfer Student Success: The Essential Role of College and University Libraries (ABC-CLIO)* written in collaboration with Karen F. Kaufmann. Nuhn holds a BS in business management and MS in Library and Information Science.

Carissa Baker is an Assistant Professor of Theme Park and Attraction Management at the University of Central Florida (UCF) in Orlando, Florida.
