
1. Log in to Canvas and select the course you would like to input a ISLO rubric to your already existing rubric
2. Navigate to your assignments and select the assignment being used for assignment linking
3. In your already created rubric you will select + criterion




4. Select “New Criterion.”




6. Your finished ISLO Criterion should look like below.

ISLO AT - Propose Solutions An appropriate response to a challenge, a problem, or a research question; a deep comprehension of the problem represents students' ability to go beyond the word-for-word outlined problem.	<b>4 pts</b> Level 4 Proposes one or more solutions/hypotheses/theses (solution) that indicate a deep comprehension of the presented problem and acknowledges contextual factor(s).	<b>3 pts</b> Level 3 Proposes one or more solutions that indicate comprehension of the problem and are sensitive to contextual factor(s).	<b>2 pts</b> Level 2 Proposes one solution that is generic or generally applicable rather than individually designed to address the specific contextual factors.	<b>1 pts</b> Level 1 Proposes a solution that is difficult to evaluate because it is vague or only indirectly addresses the presented problem.	<b>0 pts</b> Insignificant Evidence Insignificant evidence for scoring.	4 pts
ISLO AT - Analysis An examination of information; rubric primarily focuses on the process of reviewing and investigating the presented problem and potential solutions.	<b>4 pts</b> Level 4 Analysis process is in-depth; examines the feasibility of the solution and its impact in a way that is organized and synthesizes evidence to reveal insightful patterns, differences, or similarities related to problem/solution.	<b>3 pts</b> Level 3 Analysis process is adequate; determines the feasibility and weighs impacts of solution with organized evidence to reveal important patterns, differences, or similarities related to problem/solution.	<b>2 pts</b> Level 2 Analysis process is brief; only determines impact OR determines feasibility with organized evidence, but the organization is not effective in revealing important patterns, differences, or similarities regarding the problem/solution.	<b>1 pts</b> Level 1 Analysis process is superficial; does not determine the impact or discuss the feasibility of solutions and minimally lists evidence without organization and/or it is unrelated to the problem/solution.	<b>0 pts</b> Insignificant Evidence Insignificant evidence for scoring.	4 pts
ISLO AT - Conclusions A synthesis of key findings drawn from the analysis and evidence	<b>4 pts</b> Level 4 Conclusion stated is a rational and warranted synthesis and expression of what the student learned; given informed reasoning from the completed analysis with the integration of evidence (such as quantitative and/or qualitative information)	<b>3 pts</b> Level 3 Conclusion stated is focused solely on the analysis with minimal focus/emphasis on the reasoning or evidence (such as quantitative and/or qualitative information)	<b>2 pts</b> Level 2 Conclusion stated is based on information chosen to fit the desired results without insight from the completed analysis and reasoning.	<b>1 pts</b> Level 1 Conclusion is inconsistent, ambiguous, illogical, or unsupportable from the analysis.	<b>0 pts</b> Insignificant Evidence Insignificant evidence for scoring.	4 pts
ISLO AT - Applications Applying the findings from the analysis and synthesized conclusion to inform future work or decisions	<b>4 pts</b> Level 4 Reviews and acknowledges results; Applies findings from analysis relative to the problem defined with thorough, specific considerations of need for further work or applications	<b>3 pts</b> Level 3 Reviews and acknowledges results; Applies findings from analysis relative to the problem defined with some consideration of need for further work or applications.	<b>2 pts</b> Level 2 Reviews and acknowledges results in terms of the problem defined with little, if any, consideration of need for further work or applications. Minimal application of findings from the analysis.	<b>1 pts</b> Level 1 Reviews results superficially in terms of the problem defined with no consideration of need for further work or applications based on the analysis.	<b>0 pts</b> Insignificant Evidence Insignificant evidence for scoring.	4 pts
